Study Guide for the Sermon on the Mount

In the same way that shorter and longer hikes can be planned from a central position on a map, so too the following study guide provides various "reading paths" in the Bible with the Sermon on the Mount as the starting point. The reader should begin by choosing a passage from the Sermon (together with the discussion of it in this book) and then study the sections of the Bible listed here in days that follow. At the conclusion of this the reader can reconsider the passage which functioned as the starting point. It goes without saying that this roster composed of selected passages around specific themes only intends to offer a variation on book by book Bible study whereby the Scriptures are read in their unity.
