

INTRODUCTION

The Story of the Bible - The History of Salvation came about as an effort to teach a certain group of people who lived in the jungles of Papua (formerly Irian Jaya), Indonesia the story of the history of the salvation of man which is told by God in His Word, the Bible. The Story of the Bible - The History of Salvation is the first part of an extensive Bible Program set up for those who, after attending the preaching of God's Word, sought to be more systematically instructed in the awesome work of our most wonderful Creator God who not only created all things but also graciously works out a redemption of part of mankind after man chose to fall into sin in Paradise. The Story of the Bible – The History of Salvation highlights the story of how God was faithful and kept His promise of sending a Redeemer to Adam and Eve in Paradise throughout the generations, even though His chosen people were unfaithful time and time again. God sent His Son Jesus Christ to earth to take on human form in order to bear the burden of His wrath against the sin of man. Today, it is no longer the chosen Israelite nation who are God's chosen people but all those who by the power of the Holy Spirit believe in Jesus Christ as their Saviour, repent from their sinful ways and strive to live God-honouring and God-glorifying lives who are God's chosen people. This story of the Bible, this history of salvation, is still in progress today for Christ is presently in heaven interceding for us and gathering in His chosen people on earth through His sent-out Spirit and preachers of His Word. It will culminate on that final Day when our Lord Jesus Christ will return to take up all those who believed His Gospel of Salvation and lived in its assurance to eternal glory!

The History of Salvation was written originally in the Indonesian language in 1986. It uses a simple question and answer format to help those who follow the program remember the highlights of the stories that were told. The illustrations reinforce highlights of each story. Each lesson is based on Scripture texts which are to be read and explained by the instructor and form the basis of the lesson. The questions and answers, although intended to be the basic memory material for the lesson, may also form a jumping board for more discussion.

While *The History of Salvation* highlights the story of how God was faithful to His promise of redeeming man from the curse of sin, the second part of the Bible course, *The Teachings of the Bible – The Simplified Catechism*, concentrates on the doctrines of God, as revealed to us in the Bible. Those who successfully followed the entire course (*The History of Salvation* and *The Simplified Catechism*), sincerely believed in Jesus Christ as their Saviour and committed their lives to the LORD were baptized and became living members of the church. Some also became instructors of this course. It was found that these books were not only beneficial for those who could not read very well or not at all, but also for those who were blessed with more education because the doctrines of Scripture where explained in simple day-to-day terms.

The History of Salvation and The Simplified Catechism have been translated into English in order to make them more widely available to others who may want to use it or translate it again into a different language to aid them in their teaching of the history of salvation and the doctrines of God's Word, albeit in a mission or outreach situation or in the home.

It is our hope and prayer that *The History of Salvation* may be helpful in the instruction of the awesome greatness of our Almighty God and His faithfulness to His covenant promises. May such instruction bring many to also seek instruction in the doctrines of salvation (*The Simplified Catechism*) and so come to faith in Jesus Christ. May His Name be praised, and His Works be proclaimed to the ends of the earth! To Him be the glory and honour!

GUIDE TO UNDERSTANDING THE PAGE LAYOUT



TEACHING THE LESSONS

The author encourages the teacher who uses this book to consider the following:

- Before going to class, prepare well for teaching. This includes praying for God's guidance and carefully reading the Bible texts associated with the lessons you will teach. This will help you gain a good understanding of the Bible stories and the context from which these questions and answers come. Further, prepare for reading or telling the Bible texts and/or stories you will read or tell about at the beginning of your teaching session.
- 2. It is good to begin each lesson with Bible reading and prayer, after which each student should be given the opportunity to answer all the questions of the last lesson before you teach a new lesson (thorough oral review).
- 3. It is also good to do an additional quick oral review of the two lessons previous to the last lesson, asking questions to all the students in turn.
- 4. Thus, the teaching sessions would go as follows:
 - Day 1 teach the new lesson for the day
 - Day 2 thorough review of day 1's lesson and then teach the new lesson for the day.
 - Day 3 quick review of day 1's lesson, then thorough review day 2's lesson, and then teach the new lesson for that day.
 - Day 4 quick review of day 1 and 2's lesson, then thoroughly review day 3's lesson, and then teach the new lesson for that day.
 - Day 5 quick review of day 2 and 3's lesson, then thoroughly review day 4's lesson, and then teach the new lesson for that day.

- 5. It is of utmost importance to have frequent reviews. Through repetitively answering the questions, the student will retain the material well. The teacher will take into consideration the learning abilities of the participants of the class.
- 6. Professing one's faith is expressing one's faith in words and deeds. The catechism instruction is primarily concerned with expressing the doctrine of faith. Thus, the students need to personally answer the questions addressed to him/her.
- 7. It is good to stop and do a section review each time you have completed a certain section such as Abraham, Israel, The Law etc.
- 8. Refer frequently to the Timeline of *The Story of the Bible The History of Salvation* with the students so that they can understand how this story shows how God was and is faithful in keeping His promise to Adam and Eve in Paradise of sending a Redeemer/Saviour. He was faithful throughout the generations until today, even though His chosen people were unfaithful time and time again.
- 9. The whole program can take up to two years. However, the result will be that the participants truly know and understand how God works in the hearts of His people from generations to generations. Those who truly know and understand the Word of God and why they believe His Word will become joyful Christians. The Holy Spirit strengthens faith through the preaching and teaching of the Word of God. Poor teaching leaves weak Christians and weak churches, and as the Lord said via Hosea "through lack of knowledge My people are destroyed" Hosea 4:6.
- This method has proven to build strong churches under the gracious blessings of the Lord. May we teachers be faithful for as James wrote "you know that we who teach will be judged more strictly", James 3:1. Nevertheless, "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up", Galatians 6:9.

May God bless the teaching of His Word for the furtherance of His Kingdom and glory to His Name!

That a believer can sometimes lack in faith and trust in God.

God had already promised the land of Canaan

Lot's wife looked back.

How did God punish her?

in order to bury Sarah.

Why did Isaac and Rebekah have to wait a long time to receive children?

God wanted to test Isaac to see

if he believed the promise of God.

What was this promise of God?

Isaac prayed to God

and asked God for a child.

Did God answer Isaac?

Yes, God gave them twin boys, Esau and Jacob.

Who is the oldest child?

Esau.

What is the inheritance right or birthright of the oldest child?

When the father dies, the oldest child

would receive two parts of the inheritance.



But who received the birthright?

With whom did God choose to continue His covenant?

How did God punish Jacob?

God spoke to Jacob in a dream

and said that He would be with Jacob

and watch over him wherever he went.



Haran

Why?

God never forgets

the covenant He made with Abraham.

Where did Jacob stay in Haran?

He stayed with his uncle Laban.



How many years did Jacob stay in Haran?

He stayed 20 years.

Then God told Jacob to go back to Canaan.

How many wives did Jacob have?

He had 2 wives: Leah and Rachel.

Joseph ordered his brothers

to bring Benjamin with them

when they returned to buy food again.

Why were the Israelites oppressed in Egypt?

Because after many years,

a new king who did not know about Joseph

Why was this new Pharaoh afraid of the Israelites? Because the number of Israelites had grown and they had become a large, strong nation.

How did Pharaoh oppress the Israelites? The Israelites were forced into hard labour.

Did this make the Israelite nation weak? No, they only increased in number and became stronger.

What did Pharaoh order when he saw this? Pharaoh ordered that all boy babies born to the Israelites be thrown into the Nile River.

and covered it with tar. She put Moses in

it and put the basket among the reeds

in the river. Pharaoh's daughter saw

the basket and found the baby.



Did Pharaoh's daughter want to drown Moses according to the command of Pharaoh?

No, she felt sorry for the baby

and wanted to take care of it.

Who saw to it that Moses would be saved?

God saved Moses from the hand of Pharaoh.

Why?

Because Pharaoh wanted to kill Moses because Moses had killed an Egyptian.



How long did Moses stay in Midian?

Moses stayed in Midian for 40 years until God called him.

How did God save the Israelites?

God sent a strong east wind,

which drove the sea back and

turned it into dry land

What happened once they were in the sea?

God made the wheels of their chariots

get stuck and come off .

What happened when the Israelites arrived on the other side of the sea?

God made the sea return to its place.

All the Egyptians were swept into the sea

and drowned.

How long was the journey from Egypt to Canaan?

There are two routes:

- 1. the short route (about one week)
- 2. the long route (about one month)

Because the nation was so large, the Israelites would probably have needed three to four months to travel the long route.



Which route did the Israelites take?

God led the Israelites on the long route.

Why?

1. Because the short route would take them



through enemy country so there would be many wars to fight.

2. Because God wanted to make Himself known

to His people at Mount Sinai.

Because God punished His people

God is very patient because

He is faithful to His covenant,

God gave them twice as much manna

as they needed on the sixth day

What can we learn from this?

God is pleased when we prepare for the Sunday by getting and buying what we need for the Sunday on the day before. God said this day is a day of rest set apart to honour God.

What sin did the Israelites commit when they made this idol?

They sinned against the second commandment:

Worship the LORD according to His Word.



How did God punish the Israelites?

On God's command, the Levites killed about 3000 people and God sent a plague to punish the Israelites.

Numbers 13 Deuteronomy 1:19-33

53A THE TEN SPIES AND ISRAEL SIN

How did Moses explore the land of Canaan? Moses sent twelve spies to explore the situation in the land of Canaan.



How did Moses choose these men? God told Moses to send one leader from each of the tribes of Israel.

Who brought back a good report? Only two men, Joshua and Caleb brought a good report about the land.

What did the other ten spies report to Moses?

They did not bring a good report. They reported that the people in Canaan were stronger and bigger than the Israelites.







Numbers 14:1-20 Psalm 78

To whom did the Israelites listen?

They listened to the ten spies who brought the bad report. They rebelled against God and wanted to return to Egypt.



Was God pleased with the Israelites?

No.



Why was God not pleased with the decision of the Israelites?

to them many times.
